7. Internal Assessment

Regular periodic assessment shall be conducted throughout the course. Although the question of number of tests it to the institution at least three tests in theory and practical each year be held. The test preceding the university examination may be similar to the pattern of university examination. Average of the marks of the three tests for theory and practical separately shall be sent to the university.

A candidate shall secure not less than 50% of marks prescribed for internal assessment in theory and not less than 50% marks prescribed in practical, separately, in each subject/paper to be eligible to appear in the university examination.

8. Schedule of Examination

The university shall conduct two examinations annually at an interval of not less than 4 to 6 months as notified by the university from time to time. A candidate who satisfies the requirement of attendance, progress and conduct as stipulated by the university shall be eligible to appear for the university examination. Certificate to that effect shall be produced from the Head of the institution along with the application for examination and the prescribed fee.

MONITORING PROGRESS OF STUDIES:

Every candidate shall maintain a Log Book and record of her/his participation in the training programme conducted by the department such as journal reviews, seminars etc. the faculty mombers and peers will assess the presentations using relevant check list. The presentations made by the candidate should be mention in the Log Book. The log book shall be scrutinized and certified by the head of the department and head of the institution, and presented in the University Practical Examination.

M.Sc. Nursing Log Book :

The University has prescribed a log book and given as volume – It to this ordinance. It may be got printed by all the Nursing colleges having M.Sc. Nursing Course. The formal given in the log Book shall be followed by all the PG students.

DISSERTATION

Each candidate pursuing M.Sc. Nursing course is required to carryout work on selected research Project under the guidance of a recognized Post Graduate Teacher. The results of such a work shall be submitted in the form of dissertation.

The dissertation is aimed to train a graduate student in research methods and techniques. It includes identification of problems, formulation of hypothesis, search and review of literature, getting acquainted with recent advances, designing of a research study, collection of data, critical analysis, interpretation of results and drawing conclusions.

Every candidate shall submit to the Registrar (Academic) of the university in the prescribed proforms, a synopsis containing particulars of proposed dissertation work within 6 months from the date of commencement of the course on or before the date notified by the university. The synopsis shall be sent through the proper channel. Synopsis should be written as per the proforms.

Such synopsis will be reviewed and the university will register the dissertation topic. No change in the dissertation topic or guide shall be made without prior approval of the university.

The dissertation should be written under the following headings.

- () Introduction
- ii) Aims or objectives of study
- ii) Review of literature
- Material and Methods
- v) Results
- vi) Discussion
- Vil\ Conclusion
- Viii) Summery
- b) References
- Tables
- xi) Annixures

The written text of dissertation shall not be less than 50 pages and shall not exceed 100 pages excluding references, tables, questionnaires and other annexure. It should be nearly typed in double line spacing on one side of paper (A4 size, 8.27'X11.69') and bound properly. Spiral binding should not be done. A declaration by the candidate for having done the work should also be included, and certified by the guide, head of the department and head of the inutitation. Four copies of desertation shall be submitted to the Registrar (Evaluation) through proper channel along with a soft copy (C0). Three months before the final examination. It shall be assessed by two examiners, one internal and one external, appointed by the University. Acceptance of the Dissertation is a pre-requisite for a candidate appear for final examination.

If there are corrections in the dissertation suggested by the examiners, the candidate will make such corrections & will be allowed to resubmit and if approved can appear for the examination.

Il consists of Theory (Written) papers and practical examinations.

Theory - (Written) Examination:

The following three papers shall be common to all candidates irrespective of the branch/speciality chosen

- 1) Nursing education
- 2) Advance Nursing Practice
- Nursing Research and Statistics
 In addition to the above three there shall be one paper in the Nursing speciality branch chosen
 by the candidates.

Practical Examination:

There shall be practical examination in the Nursing Education and Nursing speciality branch (Nursing Speciality I) chosen by the candidate.

Criteria to Pass:

To be declared as pass in the M.Sc. list year a candidate has to pass in all the prescribed subjects for the list year and secure total aggregate Marks of 300/600 in the University examination.

01. Common subjects:

A candidate shall secure in each of the common subjects not less than 50% Marks prescribed for University Examination (40 out of 80) in the theory papers (exclusive of internal Assessment Marks)

02. Nursing Speciality subject:

A candidate shall secure not less than 50% of Marks prescribed for University Examination separately in theory (40 out of 80) and Practical Examination (100 out of 200), exclusive of Internal Assessment Marks.

Carryover:

The candidate who has failed in more than two subjects will not be promoted to the lind year.

M.Sc. Nursing IInd year Examination:

The university Examination consist of dissertation, written Papers (Theory), Practical Examination & Viva - Voce examination.

Dissertation: Only candidates who's dissertation has been accepted shall be eligible to appear for M.Sc. IInd year Examination.
