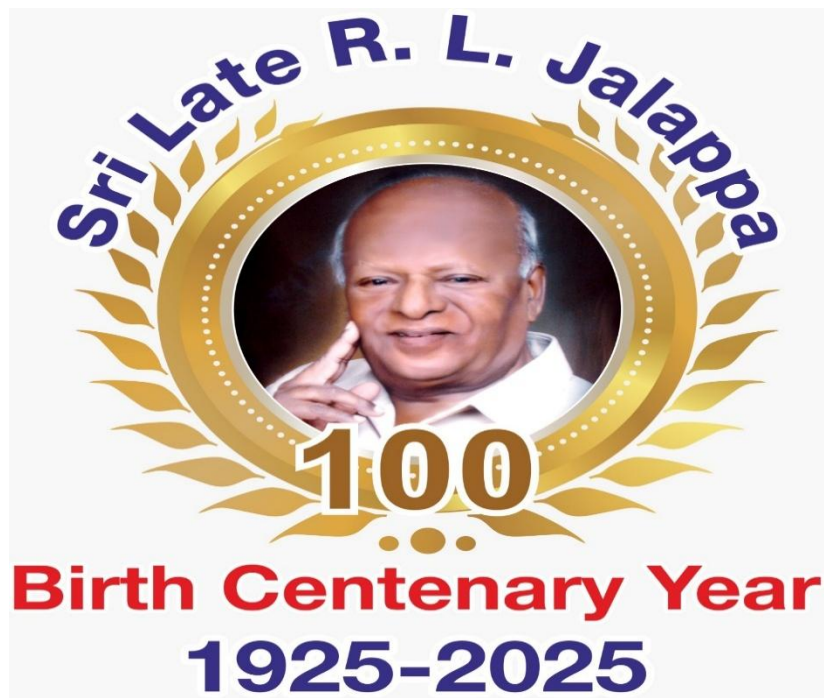

Sri. R. L. Jalappa (1925–2015) was a well-known politician, educationist and social worker from Karnataka. He was born on 19 October 1925 in Ramasagara village in Kolar district and came from a farming family. He was an active member of the Indian National Congress and served several times as a Member of the Legislative Assembly in Karnataka. He also worked as the Home Minister of Karnataka. Jalappa strongly believed that education was important for rural development, so he founded the Sri Devaraj Urs Educational Trust to provide educational opportunities, through this trust, many colleges and healthcare institutions were established in Kolar. He worked for the development of education, healthcare, and social welfare in rural areas. He passed away on 17 December 2021 and is remembered for his service to society.

R.L. 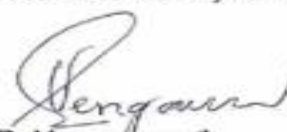

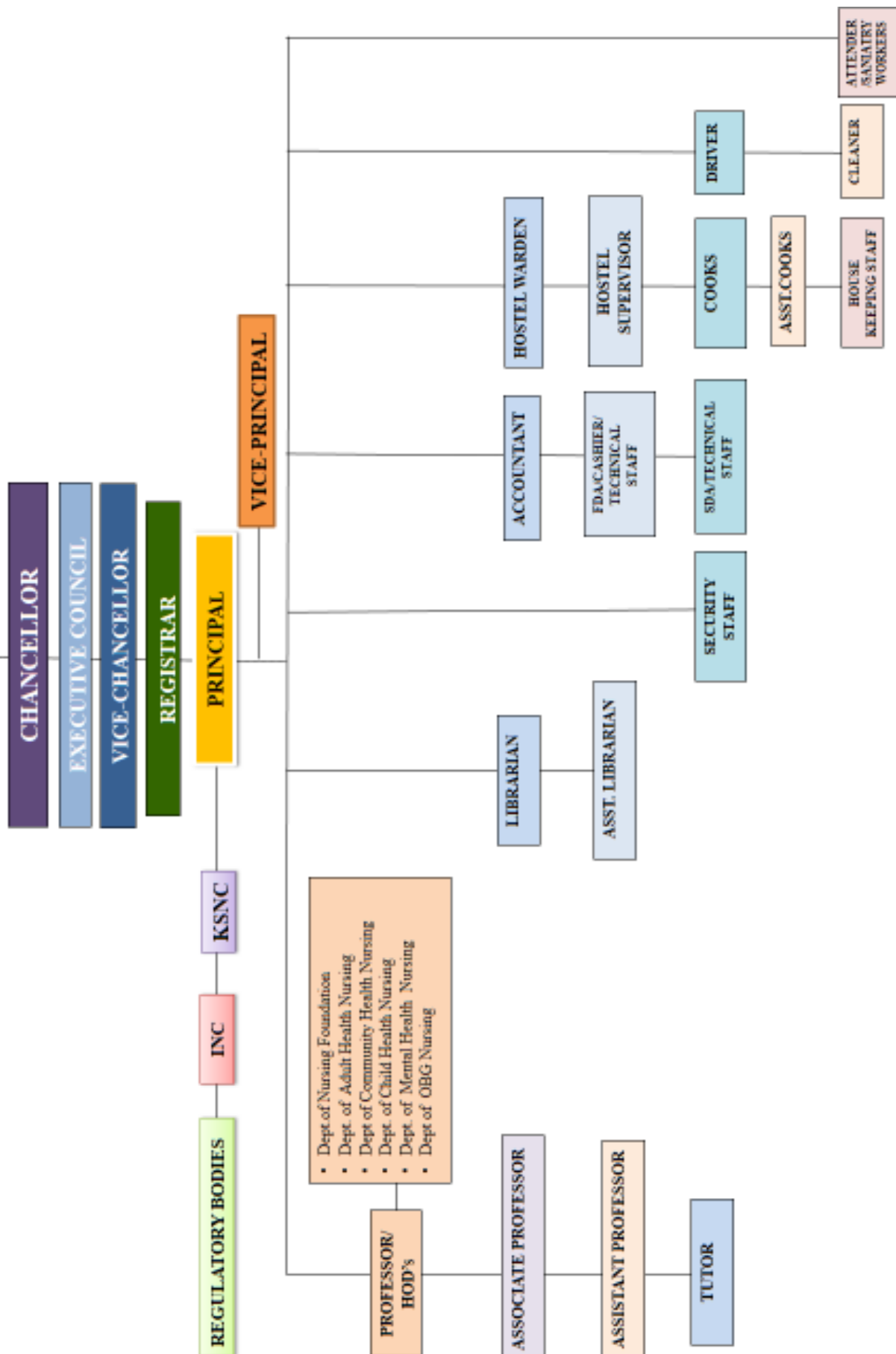

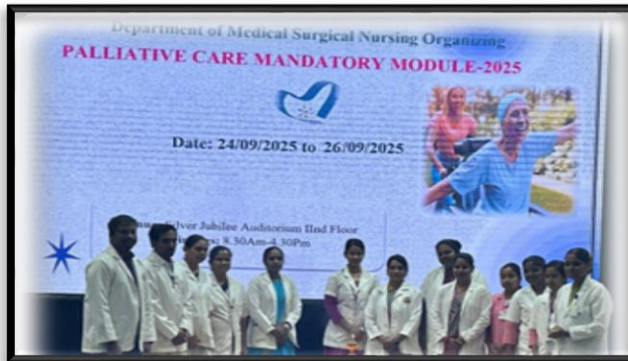
INFECTION CONTROL & SAFETY WORKSHOP
